Dr. Taylor was born and raised in Ontario. She did her undergraduate degree at the University of Toronto and then attended the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Western Ontario. She did her internal medicine training at Queen's University, Kingston and Medical Oncology at Princess Margaret Hospital in Toronto. She was certified in Internal Medicine in 1989 and Medical Oncology in 1990.

Dr. Taylor spent 9 years on staff at the London Regional Cancer Centre and was an assistant professor at the University of Western Ontario. She relocated to Kelowna and the BC Cancer Agency in 1999. She was the Professional Practice Leader for Medical Oncology at the Centre for the Southern Interior from 2004-2012. From 2012 to 2016 she was the interim Vice President of Systemic Therapy at the BCCA, and is a clinical Associate professor at UBC. At the BC Cancer Agency one of her primary responsibilities was managing the provincial Cancer Drug budget and the launch of new drug programs. Dr. Taylor has been actively involved with oncology drug approvals nationally and from 2013 to 2016 was chair of the pCODR provincial advisory group.

She completed her MBA at UBC in 2013 and is now working on a Masters in Healthcare quality. Currently she is looking forward to returning to clinical work as a medical oncologist in Kelowna and is pursuing consulting work with several health care organizations.
