

Travel Award Program Criteria — Students and Patient Group Representatives

Eligibility

Student applicants must:

- be registered as full-time students at a Canadian university or college
- submit a letter of recommendation from a professor or advisor.

Patient group applicants must:

- belong to a not-for-profit, patient-related organization, or a citizen's group interested in health policy
- submit a letter of recommendation from an executive member of the organization (e.g., President, Vice-President).

Preference will be given to applicants who:

- have an abstract accepted for presentation at the 2020 CADTH Symposium
- have submitted an abstract to the 2020 CADTH Symposium
- study or work in a field relevant to CADTH's work
- have not previously received a CADTH Symposium Travel Award.

Deadline for applications: **December 10, 2019.**

Eligible expenses may include:

- airfare, train, bus, or private vehicle
- accommodation
- incidentals, including taxis or parking
- CADTH Symposium registration, to a maximum of the registration rate for the applicant's category
- workshop fees, to a maximum of \$200.

Requests for Travel Awards must contain:

- confirmation of enrolment status from a university, or of the applicant's involvement from the Patient Group
- brief summary of interests and accomplishments
- description of anticipated benefits from attending the 2020 CADTH Symposium
- students — letter of recommendation from the applicant's professor or advisor
- patient group representative — letter of recommendation from organization executive member (e.g., President, Vice-President).

The maximum allowable travel award is \$2,000, and CADTH may elect to award only a portion of the funding requested depending on factors such as the number of requests for travel awards received and a review of estimated costs. CADTH may be unable to fund all requests.
